What is osteoarthritis?

Osteoarthritis is the technical term for chronic joint wear and tear, and is the most common joint condition affecting cats. It's an uncomfortable and progressive condition leading to reduced mobility.

Common causes:



Excess weight: extra weight means extra stress on the joints.



Accidents or trauma: any event – major or minor – that damages the joint can lead to osteoarthritis. Even daily wear can add up to joint problems eventually.



Breed: some breeds are prone to conditions which can lead to osteoarthritis.



Age: osteoarthritis is often seen in older cats.



How can the right food help?

What you feed your cat plays an important role in supporting your cats mobility.



Essential fatty acids

Effective levels of omega-3 fatty acids, including high levels of DHA from fish oil, to promote joint and kidney health. Helps break the cycle of inflammation



High-quality proteins

High level of essential amino acids to help build muscle mass and support mobility.



Antioxidants

Neutralise free radicals, promoting a healthy immune system.



Taste

Great taste cats can't wait to eat.



Controlled minerals

Controlled phosphorus and low sodium levels take the stress off your cat's kidneys.



Alertness & vitality

Enriched with antioxidants to support alertness and vitality in older cats.

Managing osteoarthritis
